

**CITY OF COTTLEVILLE
BOARD OF ALDERMEN REGULAR SESSION MINUTES
WEDNESDAY DECEMBER 17, 2025**

The Board of Aldermen held their meeting in the City Hall boardroom located at 5490 5th Street Cottleville, Missouri.

Mayor Stephen Thompson called the meeting to order at 7:06 p.m. The pledge of allegiance was recited.

- b. A Public Hearing for the Consideration of a Conditional Use Permit (CUP) for the following land uses/commercial operations: 1) "Photographic Studios, Portrait", 2) "Miscellaneous Office Uses", and 3) "Small Meeting Space"; within the S-D/OT "Special District Old Town Cottleville" located at 5501 St. Charles Street, Cottleville, MO 63304 (Formerly "Tallulah's"; Name of Property Owner/Applicant: Brynic, LLC, formerly John and Tami Powers).

The applicant stated the City has agreed in the past to remove two angled parking spaces along Highway N to allow for access to a future parking lot should they install one their property at a later date. The applicant stated they would stripe the current parking spaces in front of the businesses.

The Board of Aldermen held their meeting at City Hall located at 5490 5th Street Cottleville, Missouri.

Staff Reports

A. City Administrator

During this time, Bill Malack City Administrator and Elliot Schneider, Manager of Environmental & Fleet Services both with the City of St. Peters were present for the work session meeting to discuss the City of Cottleville's waste hauling services and the agreement renewal with them. It was noted there was no plan for a rate increase through September of 2027. However, a 5-year agreement was needed for the ability to pay out capital costs such as new cans coming and new truck purchases. It was noted the services, price and plan mimic what is provided to their own residents in the City of St. Peters. Mr. Schneider stated the strategy going forward is to keep costs going down. He mentioned the new trucks allowed them to cut their fleet by more than half. He also mentioned the addition of new services such as the STP Collects app and the ability to add a contractor's trash bag alongside your can for a additional \$5 fee. He further noted other items such as shred it events, earth center services and rec-plex discounts remain in place however their *outdoor* pools have been added. Mr. Schneider also mentioned dead animals along the roadway may be disposed of at the earth center.

Michael Padella, City Administrator, updated the Board of Aldermen on all other agenda items including the consent agenda items, additional budget changes, minibikes, and projects already bid out so they're ready to go in the new year such as; the bank stabilization project at Vantage Lake.

Beth Verseman, 218 Kenicott Drive spoke to the Mayor and Board of Aldermen regarding the large area her subdivision is required by ordinance to maintain along Highway N between the roadway and their subdivision common ground. Discussion was also held regarding reducing that area that needs to be mowed by making it a prairie grass area. In addition, discussion was held regarding moving the trail back further off the highway along with the idea of adding a pedestrian bridge and or roundabout in the future.

Lastly, Mr. Padella stated Vetta has requested an extension for their improvement project as they are still working on plans and financing.

Tom Goldkamp, City Engineer, announced the City received a grant for various pedestrian improvements starting at Motherhead Road and Gutermuth Road all the way to Weiss Road.

B. Police Chief

Chief Dave McCune was present for the meeting. Nothing further at this time.

C. City Clerk/Treasurer

Amy Lewis, City Clerk - Treasurer – provided a bill list, sales tax totals chart and minutes.




Adjournment
