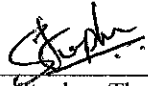

Staff Reports

City Administrator

During the meeting, City Administrator Michael Padella reviewed the agenda items with the Mayor and Board of Aldermen, including the public hearing, consent agenda, and other business items. The Board also reviewed the plans for the additional building at Avalon Park along with staff.

Discussion was held regarding the need for building elevations for the Avalon Park addition.

It was noted that the siding had arrived and has been installed at 341 Weiss Road. In addition, it was noted that Broadway Truck may be closing in relation to Item 8D.

Mayor Thompson encouraged the passage of Resolution No. 26-07 in order to improve the City's digital footprint.

Police Chief

During this time, a lengthy discussion was held regarding Bill No. 26-029 and the City's participation in the O'Fallon DFR Program versus the St. Charles County program. It was noted that the City's cost share would be approximately \$68,000 for the first 6 months; however, a grant may be available to offset a portion of the cost during the first half of the year. It was also noted that the City would have the option to opt out of the program in future years if desired. It was further noted that the program was scheduled to go live on July 1.

City Clerk/Treasurer

Amy Lewis, Director of Administrative Services – provided a bill list and a sales tax report.

City Attorney

Drew Weber, City Attorney, was present for the meeting. Nothing further at this time.

Communications from the Alderman

Alderman Holt moved to recess the work session meeting for the regular meeting 6:58pm. Alderman Krekeler seconded the motion. Motion was carried by affirmative votes of four (4) Aldermen. There were no nay votes and no abstentions.

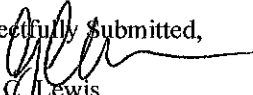

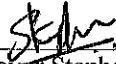
