PURPOSE

To provide engineering expertise and guidance in a variety of municipal government settings including residential and commercial development plan review, public works, public infrastructure asset management/planning, roadway safety, construction management/inspection, stormwater management, and flood plain management.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- A. Advise the Public Works Director and other city officials on all matters pertaining to engineering.
- B. Oversee the preparation of plans, specifications, and bidding schedules for construction, maintenance/repair of City public works projects.
- C. Serve as project engineer on City construction and maintenance projects and related activities.
- D. Provide plan review of subdivision, land use/zoning, development, construction applications and prepare review comments and/or provide approval/recommendation to the appropriate City governing body.
- E. Conduct field inspections of construction sites/activities to ensure compliance with city codes, development, construction standards, stormwater codes, and approved plans.
- F. Assist in the development of short- and long-range capital improvement programming and crafting the appropriate budget proposals.
- G. Administers and ensures MS4 compliance, including permitting, PRP development and implementation, management of all six (6) Minimum Control Measures (MCMs), and annual inspections and reporting.
- H. Provide Flood Plain Management and administers the FEMA flood prevention program for the City.
- I. Monitors changes in standard construction and engineering practices and when appropriate recommends updates to the applicable city codes/policy to ensure best practices are followed.

- J. Fields questions and reviews concerns/complaints from the public on a variety of topics including traffic, grading, right-of-way, easements, and site construction/development issues.
- K. Attends all Board of Aldermen, Planning and Zoning Commission and other public meetings as necessary.
- L. Other engineering services as necessary for City operations.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- A. Must possess a valid Missouri driver's license and ability to operate a motor vehicle.
- B. Ability to read, interpret and understand civil engineering drawings, architectural drawings, records, specifications, building codes, construction plans, and proposals.
- C. Knowledge of City building, land use/zoning, stormwater, development codes and regulations.

License: A current Missouri Professional Engineers License.
